I thank you for the opportunity to be President of PAWA. My thanks to the team from last year who, under the leadership of Peter, looked at how we could be more effective in our role to support WA Probus Clubs. From the feedback we received, we feel that we made significant inroads.

PAWA intends to continue building upon what we have accomplished so far and conduct more workshops and get out amongst the Clubs more often to listen and understand and offer advice. As you may be aware, PSPL and PAWA are two different organisations, but both have the same goals i.e., wanting Clubs to be successful. PAWA intends to work with PSPL to improve the working relationship. The biggest issues facing our Clubs continue to be: * Finding officer bearers for the Management Committee.

- * Finding new members.

Running a Probus Club should not be complex and intimidating as we are running social clubs and not BHP or a Government Department. We need to be practical about our approach.

People come to Probus because they want a social life to meet other people, be entertained, learn something new and feel a sense of belonging. As Clubs, we need to ensure that our focus is on the fun, friendship, and fellowship and not administration business. Word will get out if the Club is happy and thriving and thus attract new members.

All too often, we forget that Clubs and Committees are there for the members and not the other way around. I urge you to send members to our Workshops as our aim is to listen to issues, pool ideas and suggest alternatives/solutions. Clubs should consider sending not only Committee members but also other Club members who may want to learn about taking on a role in the future. We can all learn something new ad I did from the Forums and Workshops.

Likewise, PAWA is there just and email or phone call away to answer your questions and help you resolve issues. We see ourselves as the Voice of Probus in the West.

Clubs certainly differ in how they operate and thus there is no "standard" template that is applicable to all. We would like to get out and visit your Clubs and see and hear firsthand so please do not hesitate to contact us and invite us to your meetings. Ralph Sirmulis
