

## PAWA will be holding Forums during 2022.

Forum: A meeting or medium where ideas and views on a particular issue can be exchanged.

The Forum's purpose is to have an interactive session to gain and share information so that PAWA can better improve its assistance to WA Probus Clubs.

This Forum invitation is the first of a number and has been extended to 11 Probus Clubs in the *northern corridor* of Perth.

The first 4-hour forum will be on Wednesday 23rd February at the Bramston Park Community Sporting Centre, Mattingleys Approach, in Burns Beach.

## Get to know your PAWA Committee.

Consider inviting the PAWA President Peter Olney, Secretary Ralph Sirmulis or Vice President Sue Harwood to one of your meetings. They are available to assist with any issues and give advice and support where needed.

### **PREPARING FOR 2022-23**



<u>Budget</u>: Ensure that the joining and / or annual membership fees payable by members reflect the costs associated with managing your club. It is advisable to maintain one year's operating costs as a surplus. Take into account the fees payable to PSPL and PAWA and rent for your venue.

<u>Nominations for Committee positions:</u> These should be lodged with the Secretary by the February meeting but can be called from the floor on the day of the AGM if no nominations have been received. A brief description of each role may encourage members to nominate.

<u>Portfolios</u>: Ensure all new Committee members will have access to a portfolio outlining their role.

<u>E-mail address</u>: Clubs are encouraged to have a consistent e-mail address rather than the private address of the Secretary. A G-mail address is user-friendly, usually with no cost associated. All correspondence is then in a single location, easily transferred to a new Secretary.

<u>COVID-19</u>: Check the WA Government Dept. of Health regulations in relation to managing the risks associated with COVID-19 at your club. A helpful tool is the PSPL risk assessment checklist.

<u>Electrical Tagging:</u> Check that your club's electrical equipment has been tested and tagged as per the Occupational Safety and Health Act 1984.



RE COVID-19: A number of clubs have approached PAWA requesting advice and assistance in regards to how to protect their members.

PAWA recommends that:

- Clubs follow the WA State Government's advice / directives about proof of vaccination, social distancing and wearing of masks.
- Club management Committees review and upgrade their clubs <u>action</u> <u>plans</u> in response to such directives.

Clubs should make their own decisions as regards Proof of Vaccination for their meetings and outings, if they meet in venues not covered by the WA State Directive.

PAWA will continue to monitor the WA Government directives and post relevant information that may be of assistance to WA Probus Clubs. **The main reference site:** www.wa.gov.au

## Probus Club Insurance

The National Insurance Program in Australia provides coverage for approved activities. These activities include any event organised by a Club or Association such as meetings, outings, tours, trips and interest groups. The Management Committee should assess whether or not to approve an activity, after considering all the information related to the activity. This should be reflected in the Club's minutes i.e.

 Interest from members, location, availability, cost and risk assessment.

Management Committee members should ensure that Probus club members understand coverage provided to them as part of the annual capitation fee.

The National Program provides cover for Public Liability, Personal Injury (Australia only), Association Liability (protection for Club Officers) and Club Money Cover for approved Probus activities.

The National Programs do not provide cover for club property. Clubs have the option to contact AON Risk Services 1800 786 682 for property insurance available to clubs.

Clubs and Associations should report any injury, accident or injuries involving Club members or guests to PSPL, by lodging the Accident/Injury/Incident Report Form as soon as practicable. A report should be lodged with PSPL regardless of whether or not medical attention was required.
