Capitation fees are payable for all classes of members except for Non-Active Members. Capitation fees are payable for Honorary Members, even though they are not required to pay subscriptions to their club.

PSPL Capitation fees 2023-2024 are **\$16.75**

PAWA levy remains at \$2 per member.

- Reports from Committee members
- General Business and Announcements
- Introduce Guest Speaker or fun activity. Inform the Guest Speaker of the allocation of time including time for Q & A.
- Vote of thanks to Speaker.
- Confirm next meeting date & time and close Meeting.
