#### PAWA FORUMS OUTCOME SUMMARY

As part of its reinvigoration process, PAWA determined that it needed to take a more active role in supporting its WA member clubs, than had been the case over the last number of years.

Before any strategy could be formulated, PAWA acknowledged that it needed to gain a first-hand understanding of the issues of concern to clubs and their views on how best PAWA can be assist in supporting them. It was agreed that the most effective way to gain this knowledge was to have a number of face-to-face meetings with groups of Clubs i.e. a Forum.

In February, May and June of 2022, PAWA undertook three WA Club Forums. Forty-five Clubs were invited and 38 sent representatives. As a sample, these Clubs represent around 47% of the total WA Probus Club membership of around 5,300 Probians.

The Forum was essentially an interactive, but guided, question and answer session over a 3.5-hour period covering a number of subjects, viz:

- Background about Club operations
- Events and Activities what Clubs do?
- Information collection and dissemination within Clubs
- Visits/Forums get togethers
- Subsidies funding from PAWA, and
- Regionalisation.

At the conclusion there was a general opportunity for attendees to raise any other issues that were of concern to their Clubs and that had not surfaced during the Forum session. There was good exchange of information and many issues surfaced and were discussed.

The key outcomes of the Forums are summarised below and reflect the views of the Probus membership.

#### **KEY OUTCOMES**

- The community in general has virtually no knowledge or understanding of what Probus is. Coupled with this are that Clubs do not have a clear and concise definition of "what the Probus product is" that can be given to the community.
- The general view was that PSPL has the primary responsibility for increasing awareness of Probus in the community but that both PAWA and Clubs themselves can contribute.
- Word of mouth is seen as being the best way of promoting Probus Club and bringing in new members.
- Mail drops, advertising in shopping centres etc. were not seen as being of value.
- PAWA's initiative in arranging advertising in the Little Aussie Directory (now Community) was seen as being of value.
- Many Clubs are comfortable with limited membership and have their own views at to an acceptable membership number.
- Once established, very few Probus Clubs have an ongoing relationship/contact with their sponsoring Rotary Club.
- Ageing membership and members taking on Club Officer roles are a major concern for most Clubs. Attracting younger members is seen as a key priority.
- Information Days, as conducted in the past, need to have more focus on the breakout groups and sharing of information and less on the preliminary speeches.
- The concept of having the Information Days conducted via Zoom was poorly received and seen as unworkable.
- There is varying interpretation of the standard Probus Club Constitution and the purpose of Standing Resolutions.
- Too many Clubs perceive the PSPL Probus Club Handbook as a "rulebook" rather than a helpful guideline.
- Information sharing and dissemination and decision making within Clubs varies considerably and is very much tied to the monthly meeting cycle.
- Many were not aware that PSPL offered a Club micro website facility.
- The PSPL publications Active Retirees and Staying Connected were not seen as being of great value to WA Clubs as their focus seemed to be on the Eastern States.
- PAWA's Probus West publication was also seen as being of limited interest.
- PAWA's other publications (Directory, News & Notes, Outings Guide and Guest Speakers list) were considered to be of value albeit less so for country Clubs.

#### **KEY OUTCOMES Continued**

- Not many Clubs utilise the PSPL marketing material.
- Clubs generally are unclear about the roles and responsibilities of PAWA and PSPL and little understanding of the roles of WA PSPL Director, Probus District Chair, Rotary District Probus Chair and Ambassadors.
- There was little value seen in formal Regionalisation as Clubs have their own informal relationships.
- Most agreed that Forums, enabling interchange/sharing of ideas involving a number of Clubs, are of benefit and perhaps should be conducted 2-3 times per year.
- PAWA should organise multi Club social events/activities perhaps 2-3 times per year.
- PAWA needs to improve its website to enable sharing of information between Clubs particularly information relating to PAWA and Club events.
- Probus Day needs to be promoted well in advance of October to facilitate wide community awareness. However, rather than a big multi Club event, Clubs are more than likely to celebrate within their own Club or with another Club with whom they have a close relationship.
- Generally Clubs are in favour of PAWA Officers visiting their Clubs more frequently
- PAWA should not subsidise Clubs and Club events only those events/activities that involved many Clubs or that promoted Probus.

The first of these three-hour Workshops was held on 23<sup>rd</sup> June at Yokine and others are scheduled for 15<sup>th</sup> July in Floreat, 4<sup>th</sup> August in Bunbury and 19<sup>th</sup> August in Albany.

My husband was Rotary District Governor 2002-2003 and later the PAWA committee both of which I supported him fully and enjoyed the challenge. I have been honoured with a prestigious Paul Harris award, which is presented for outstanding service to Rotary and the Community.

The Rotary Club of Swan Valley has awarded me Life Membership of the Club.

I was a Foundation member of Ellenbrook Probus Club who just celebrated 15 years of fun and fellowship. I have made so many great friends, having various management positions during this period.

I have been honoured recently to join the Probus Association of Western Australia's Committee.
