DIFFICULTY FINDING COMMITTEE MEMBERS?

Most Probus Clubs seem to have difficulty finding members who are prepared to serve on the Club's Management Committee.

Did you know that for a Club to operate, you only need a President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer.

The other Committee roles are optional but make it easier to run the Club.

Do our Clubs over complicate the roles of Committee members and make them seem too complex?

One of the most significant negative impacts of over complicating office bearer roles is that it can lead to a lack of engagement and participation among members. When roles are overly complex and require a significant amount of time and effort to fulfil, it can discourage members from stepping up to take on these responsibilities. This can leave the club with a shortage of volunteers and can make it more difficult to accomplish its goals.
