SUMMARY OF FINDINGS FROM FORUMS AND WORKSHOPS



President Peter Olney and Secretary Ralph Sirmulis delivered the August presentation and introduced the committee members who facilitated the workshop in ALBANY in August.

- Community awareness of Probus is non-existent
- Advertising/promotion of Probus is required-primarily a PSPL role
- Poor knowledge of PAWA
- Poor knowledge of the role of PSPL and almost non-existent knowledge of PSPL roles e.g. Probus District Chair, Rotary Probus District Chair, PSPL Director WA or Ambassador.
- Almost no ongoing connection with sponsoring Rotary Club
- Ageing membership an issue
- Finding office bearers a major and ongoing issue
- Word of mouth the most effective source of members
- Poor quality of PSPL and PAWA websites
- Little knowledge of PSPL micro website facility
- Clubs generally not aware of what is available from PSPL
- PSPL Club Handbook interpreted by many Clubs as a "Rulebook"
- Clubs have a limited understanding of Constitution and Standing Resolutions
- PSPL publications too frequent and Eastern States oriented
- Formal Regionalisation not perceived of practical value
- Concept of Information days via Zoom considered impractical
- Past Information Days poorly regarded as too much focus on initial "Marketing presentations"
- Clubs want more information sharing about what other clubs do
- PAWA have a role in organising multi club events/activities
- PAWA should link with other Senior groups in the community
- PAWA needs to have a presence at "Have a Go Day" in November
- PAWA should not offer subsidies/grants
- Probus Day not seen as a major event to clubs
- Clubs still using cash, cheques, and handwritten reports; hardly anyone with computer skills. Unaware of insurance implications with cash.
- Clubs are selective in passing on information from PAWA and PSPL
- Not much interaction between Clubs (on joint activities).


