Moreover, again PAWA invites thinkers and doers to contribute to its committee, emphasising that their efforts will directly benefit our WA clubs.



- <u>Did you know?</u> Clubs are only required to provide a *minimum* of each member's first and last name to Probus South Pacific Ltd.
- A condition of membership of your club is a completed application form with your name, address, telephone and/or mobile number and email address, to be included in the Club's register.

Fundraising For Your Club:

In the December edition of News and Notes, President Ralph referred to the PSPL increase in Capitation Fees and how the extra cost may make it more difficult for some Clubs to pay the Fee without increasing their annual subscription. Ralph suggested rather than increasing membership as a solution, and to ensure accessibility and inclusivity for all members who may not be able to afford the increase, it is crucial to exploring innovative solutions like fundraising.



As a result of Ralph's statement several Clubs have been querying whether a Club may fundraise, isn't it a no, no?

Yes, a Club can fundraise for its own benefit. Each Club's constitution states that it not be, or be seen, as a fundraising body. However, Clubs can source additional funds throughout the year through activities such as lucky door prizes, adding an extra dollar to the cost of a function, this creating a function surplus. Prizes can either be purchased by the Club or donated by local businesses. Monies collected from these activities do not amount to fundraising because they are added to the general funds of the Club and the funds are spent to benefit the Club members.

Fundraising that is not allowed, is monies raised for the benefit of third parties, such as a person, charity or specific cause. As an example, a Club could not run a BBQ or a raffle to raise monies for a specific person, cause or charity.

Although if a Club wanted to donate money it has accumulated in its general funds to a charity or specific cause, it can do so, provided the Club's membership approves of such a donation.

Remember Probus is all about fun, friendship and fellowship with fellow retirees.
