GUIDELINES for EFFECTIVE MEETINGS

<u>Effective meetings can inspire teamwork which can have a positive effect</u> <u>on the overall contentment of members.</u>

Plan to:

- Start and finish on time.
- Welcome members and guests and thank them for attending.
- Explain the emergency plan and facilities.
- Request phones are turned off.
- Ensure committee reports are concise.
- Stay on topic and use peoples time and energy well.

Agenda:

- Prioritise the Agenda by allowing time for important items. (don't dwell on trivial items).
- Have clear steps and deadlines.

Focus on fun, friendship, and fellowship.

- Foster a supporting atmosphere.
- Include interesting guest speakers.
- Try a quiz or games day occasionally.
- Have a theme day.
- Celebrate birthdays and milestones.

Differences of opinion.

- Productive discussions are essential to your club's success.
- Consider how you react to disagreements and challenging situations.
- Challenge the idea, not the person.
- Respect each other's point of view even if you don't agree with it.
- Encourage respectful listening.
- Appreciate everyone's contribution.

Record keeping.

- Consider having a minute-taker.
- Keep statements as neutral as possible. (Personal observations or judgmental comments should not be included).
- Concise minutes. Summarize the major points of what happened at the meeting. (Avoid writing down everything everyone said).

JOURNEY ALONG THE OTHER MURRAY RIVER



On Wednesday 7th February, members of the **Probus Club of Eaton** boarded a bus and headed to Mandurah for a lunch cruise through the Peel Inlet and along the Murray River.

At first, we were sailing through Mandurah and its canal developments but then we left civilization behind and drifted through mud islands, sand banks covered in reeds and salt bush, passed swans, Pelicans, Ospreys and tiny Siberian visitors. The crew put out a snack of cheeses, cold meats, olives and biscuits which was an unexpected treat, and the bar was open for drinks.

After a relaxing hour or so, we pulled into a sandy, she-oak covered island and went ashore. It was Cooleenup Island, where a guide met us and then led the group down a surprisingly well-made pathway, as he explained some of the issues faced by the island. There are permanent residents there and sewage is a problem. Then we were led round a corner and were met by a most unexpected sight. It was an historic grain mill, just like that near the freeway in South Perth. The mill was built in 1843 by Joseph Cooper and has been lovingly restored. Its setting on the edge of this island makes it a very attractive tourist site.

Once back on board we went a little further upstream to within sight of the Forrest Highway bridge before turning around. A sumptuous lunch was served of cold meat, salads, prawns in their shells and finally sweets.







As we approached Mandurah, the day was capped off by three dolphins surfing our bow wave for ages – right beside the boat for us to see how beautiful they were.

This was a very special and relaxing day – we felt like Huckleberry Finn drifting down the river, but as with all adventures, reality caught up with us at last and we had to get back on the bus. It was a wonderful day!
