PAWA ensured the involvement of both city and country WA Clubs by holding the Workshops in North Beach, Albany, Bunbury, Halls Head, Mt Pleasant and Glen Forrest. Our thanks to the Probus Clubs that helped us facilitate these Workshops.

Attendees were given the opportunity to understand challenges confronting their clubs, ranging from governance matters to the intricacies of the WA Associations Act. The importance of understanding the Act and its implications for Club Constitutions and Standing Resolutions was underscored, empowering attendees with vital legal knowledge essential for effective club management.

Furthermore, the Workshops provided a much-needed platform for clarifying the sometimes-differing interpretations surrounding insurance, outings, events, and activities. Attendees gained invaluable insights into risk management practices and compliance requirements, enabling them to navigate potential pitfalls with confidence and foresight.

Perhaps one of the most praised benefits of the Workshops was the opportunity for networking and knowledge exchange. Attendees hailed from diverse backgrounds and experiences, each bringing a different perspective to the table. Through sometimes spirited discussions and shared anecdotes, participants gleaned from the collective wisdom of their peers, gaining fresh perspectives on tackling common challenges that face our Clubs in WA.

However, amidst the celebration of success, a sobering reality remains: there are still clubs hesitant to embrace change and reluctant to participate in our Workshops. It is a concern to PAWA which recognises the imperative of adapting to a changing Probus landscape. The Workshops served as a wake-up call, urging clubs to shed complacency and embrace innovation. For PAWA, the message is clear: the status quo is no longer tenable. To thrive in a changing world, Probus Clubs must embrace continuous learning and evolution, leveraging opportunities to build better clubs for the years to come.

#### Can a club fundraise for its own benefit?

Yes, a Club can fundraise for its own benefit.


Each Club's constitution states that it is not seen as a fundraising body. However, Clubs can source additional funds throughout the year through activities such as lucky door prizes, adding an extra dollar to the cost of a function, this creating a function surplus.

Prizes can either be purchased by the Club or donated by local businesses. Monies collected from these activities do not amount to fundraising because they are added to the general funds of the Club and the funds are spent to benefit the Club members.

Fundraising that is not allowed, is monies raised for the benefit of third parties, such as a person, charity or specific cause.

As an example, a Club could not run a BBQ or a raffle to raise monies for a specific person, cause or charity.

Although if a Club wanted to donate money it has accumulated in its general funds to a charity or specific cause, it can do so, provided the Club's membership approves of such a donation.


Anne presented Diana with a 35<sup>th</sup> Anniversary certificate and noted that it is a lovely vibrant club doing lots of activities.

#### NEW SPEAKER TERENCE MCGONIGLE Clinical Audiologist BSc (hons), MSc

I am a Local Audiologist at Advanced Hearing Western Australia (Busselton) and we are currently undertaking outreach in our local area. We are offering casual information sessions to improve knowledge around the importance of hearing and aural health to healthy aging.

My background is in medical research and prior to relocating to the Southwest I was engaged in research at the Sarich Neuroscience Research Institute in the field of neurodegeneration. Recent publications in the field have now indicated untreated hearing loss as the leading modifiable risk factor for dementia and cognitive decline.

Here in Australia, we have some of the highest levels of government funding to support hearing, including free (fully subsidized) hearing tests and hearing aids for eligible pensioners. I would like to offer your members the opportunity to both hear about and ask questions about some of the latest research.
