PROBUS CLUBS & PRIVACY PRINCIPLES

Many members are somewhat confused or have incorrect perceptions as regards privacy of their information. Management Committees and members need to be aware of the implications even though these are not onerous.

There are four documents that cover the issue of "privacy" within Probus Clubs. These are:

- The Privacy Act of 1988,
- The WA Associations Act of 2015,
- The Probus club Constitution, and
- The Probus Club Membership application form.

The Privacy Act 1988

<u>Under the current Privacy Act 1988 any business or association that has an annual turnover</u> of less than \$3 million is **exempt** from complying with the Australian Privacy Act of 1988.

The WA Associations Act of 2015 & the "Standard" Probus Club Constitution

The Associations Act of WA 2015 states:

- An up-to-date members' register must be maintained and made available to any member to inspect and copy on request.
- Provide a copy of the register of members upon receipt of a written request (to the Secretary) from a member.
- A list of committee members and office bearers, together with their residential, postal, business or email address must be maintained and made available to any member to access or copy on request.

These conditions are addressed in the "standard" Probus Club Constitutions.

Probus Club Membership Application Form

The current "standard" PSPL issued Probus Club Membership Application Form clearly sets out certain conditions related to the privacy of a member's information, and it is the responsibility of members to acknowledge this. In essence, a member consents to:

- Name, address, telephone number and email address being included in the 'Directory of Members' to be distributed only to members of the Club.
- PSPL can use a member's information unless members specifies otherwise.
- The minimum information required by PSPL is first name and last name and that it is a member's to advise otherwise.
- The Club and/or PSPL may publish photographs or videos of members on their websites, in newsletters and on social media to promote the Club and Probus generally unless advised otherwise.

Probus Clubs can publish their Membership List to all members of the club, but the list cannot be shared outside of the club.

Conclusion

So, in summary, Clubs need to be aware:

- Members can request access to the membership register
- Members' contact details can be circulated to other Club members
- PSPL can use membership information as they decide unless otherwise stated.



The PAWA Committee has decided to set up a Facebook page which is intended to help promote Probus in Western Australia.

Clubs will be able to post articles and pictures of their events and activities and see what other Clubs are doing.

The Page will be made available very soon and Clubs in WA will be advised when it is active and what are PAWA's guidelines.

PAWA hopes that **all** PAWA member Club will follow the page and provide input and suggestions.

PAWA Committee members enjoy visiting our Probus Clubs to see how "we all do the same thing but do it differently".

Bunbury Ladies Probus Club will be forty years young in 2025.

In the last twelve months we have had many and varied well organised outings, usually involving the hire of a bus. This is important in enabling us to go further afield for entertainment than would normally be within the "driving" comfort zone of some of our all-female membership and means that no one is excluded for that reason.

In the past year Bunbury Ladies Probus has cruised the **Donnelly River**, the **Mandurah Canals** at **Christmas**, travelled on the **Hotham Valley Steam Train**, had **High Tea at Little Wren Farm** at **Lake Clifton**, and seen the sights of **Nannup during the Tulip Festival**.

We have also had more purposeful outings to the **Lithium Mine at Greenbushes**, and a tour of the **Port of Bunbury.** There have been group outings to musical performances at **Bunbury Regional Entertainment Centre**, and also a couple of "**Mystery Tours**.

We have a strong and democratic committee, whose members work well together, making committee meetings fun and amiable. We have put a lot of thought into succession planning. Because of rising hire costs, last year we reduced the footprint of the space we use for our meetings, which has turned out to be beneficial in that it has much less formal seating arrangements, leading to better mixing and conversation among members. An unexpected bonus!

Once a year we have a "Friendship Day", when members are asked to invite a friend or two along to a general meeting. Recruitment is an ongoing issue for all of us, to compensate for an aging membership.

The contact person should not be a club member.


These cards are available from the PSPL website. It is advisable that emergency information includes all visitors and participants.
