This is the first formal advice to WA Probus Clubs as regards the PAWA Annual General Meeting.

It is essential that we have a quorum of PAWA member Clubs represented at the AGM and therefore we urge all clubs to have a voting delegate attend this important event in addition to any other Club officer/members who may wish to attend.

Reports will be presented by the PAWA President and PAWA Treasurer, followed by the election of the 2025/26 PAWA office bearers (the Executive Officers).

Nomination Forms for PAWA Committee members will be sent out in a couple of weeks to enable Clubs to nominate members for the PAWA Committee.

In February, brief biographies of Probians standing for the positions of President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer will also be sent out together with the Nomination Forms for these Executive positions. Clubs are welcome to nominate anyone that they feel should stand for one of these Executive positions. In addition, Proxy Voting Forms will also be supplied for those Clubs who wish to vote but cannot attend the Meeting.

Please note that all PAWA member Clubs are entitled to have two members on the PAWA Committee but only one has voting rights.

The cost of attendance at the AGM is \$15 per attendee – payable at registration.

Light refreshments will be available at the conclusion of the meeting.

The AGM is expected to conclude by 12 noon after which Probians can enjoy fellowship and refreshments in the comfortable surroundings of the Centre.

The full AGM "package" will be sent out to all Clubs around the middle to end of February and Clubs will be followed up as regards attendance Registration.
