By now, all Clubs should have reviewed the new "standard" Constitution, sought endorsement from their members, and lodged it with DLGIRS. If this step has not yet been completed, it should be treated as a priority. Likewise, hopefully many Clubs are well underway in tailoring their Standing Resolutions to the proposed new "standard" format.

The time is fast approaching when Clubs need to begin planning for their Management Committees for the coming year. This is always an important process, ensuring continuity, stability, and fresh ideas for the benefit of all members. Some Clubs are fortunate in having a number of people keen to step into positions, while others often find it more difficult to persuade members to take on roles.


It is important to remind everyone that the key positions – President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Vice President – are not complicated. These roles are vital to the smooth running of a Club, but they are not intended to be overly demanding. The golden rule to remember is to **keep it simple**. The President's role is primarily one of leadership and encouragement, not of carrying the entire workload. The Secretary is the communication hub, responsible for records and correspondence but without the need for long reports. The Treasurer manages straightforward finances with the aid of modern banking and reporting tools, and the Vice President provides continuity and support.

Sometimes members hesitate because they feel they cannot measure up to a previous office bearer. It is worth emphasising that no two office holders will ever be exactly the same, and nor should they be. Everyone brings their own personality, skills, and approach. The only expectation is that each person does their best. A willing member with enthusiasm is far more valuable to a Club than someone who feels pressured to emulate their predecessor.

REFUND AND PAYMENT POLICY FOR CLUBS

It is advisable that Clubs establish a payment and refund policy to clearly set out the terms and conditions around payments for such things as, joining fees, annual subscriptions and outings, activities or tours.

Joining Fees and Annual Subscriptions

It is up to each Club to determine whether they have a refund policy and/ or a pro rata payment in relation to joining fees and annual subscriptions.

Payments for outings, activities and/or tours

With more and more businesses seeking a deposit to secure a booking for outings and activities, it is advisable that Clubs have a policy that covers payments and refunds. When developing this policy consider: -

Setting a required deposit with the expression of interest. This also assists with numbers for these activities as expressing an interest without the commitment of a payment often increases the likelihood of cancellations.

Setting a date for final payment.

Cancellations and Refunds

Ensure that the members are fully aware of the cancellation and refund policy WHEN the activity is first being promoted, so that there are no misunderstandings.

The entitlement to a refund will vary depending on monies paid and commitments given to bookings with third parties. Where possible, sufficient notice should be given of cancellations to allow the Club to offer those cancelled spots to other members, where possible.

Insurance

A reminder that only approved activities will be covered under the Probus National Insurance Programs, subject always to the terms, conditions, limitations and exclusions of the policies within those programs. These activities include any event organised by a Club or Association such as meetings, outings, tours, trips and interest groups.

The National Insurance Programs do not provide cover for cancellation/refunds nor do they provide cover for illness.

Please note:

Clubs manage their individual reimbursement to guest speakers. PAWA has no input into what clubs provide as acknowledgement for a presentation, or if speakers require a fee. It is a good idea to have some communication with the speaker in advance, regarding this matter.

RISK ASSESSMENT

PSPL clearly states, in the Risk Management Policy Guidelines, that it is not mandatory for a Club to have a Risk Management Policy.


The documents provide a suggestion as "matters that should be considered" when a Club is planning and outing or activity. Some Clubs take this to the nth degree and often physically investigate the venue beforehand.

The PSPL Probus Club Handbook states:

".... Clubs and Associations should take all reasonable steps to protect the health and welfare of their members/visitors at any Probus organised, managed or sponsored activity. These activities include any event organised by a Club or Association such as meetings, outings, tours, trips and interest groups." "Risk management does not have to be an onerous task."

It should suffice for an Outings Officer to obtain information from the venue itself as to issues that may affect Club members visiting the venue. Such issues should be communicated to members, before they register their interest in participating, so that they are aware of site issues that may affect their mobility of health in any way.
